Complete the following steps in your Grofar Student Passport:

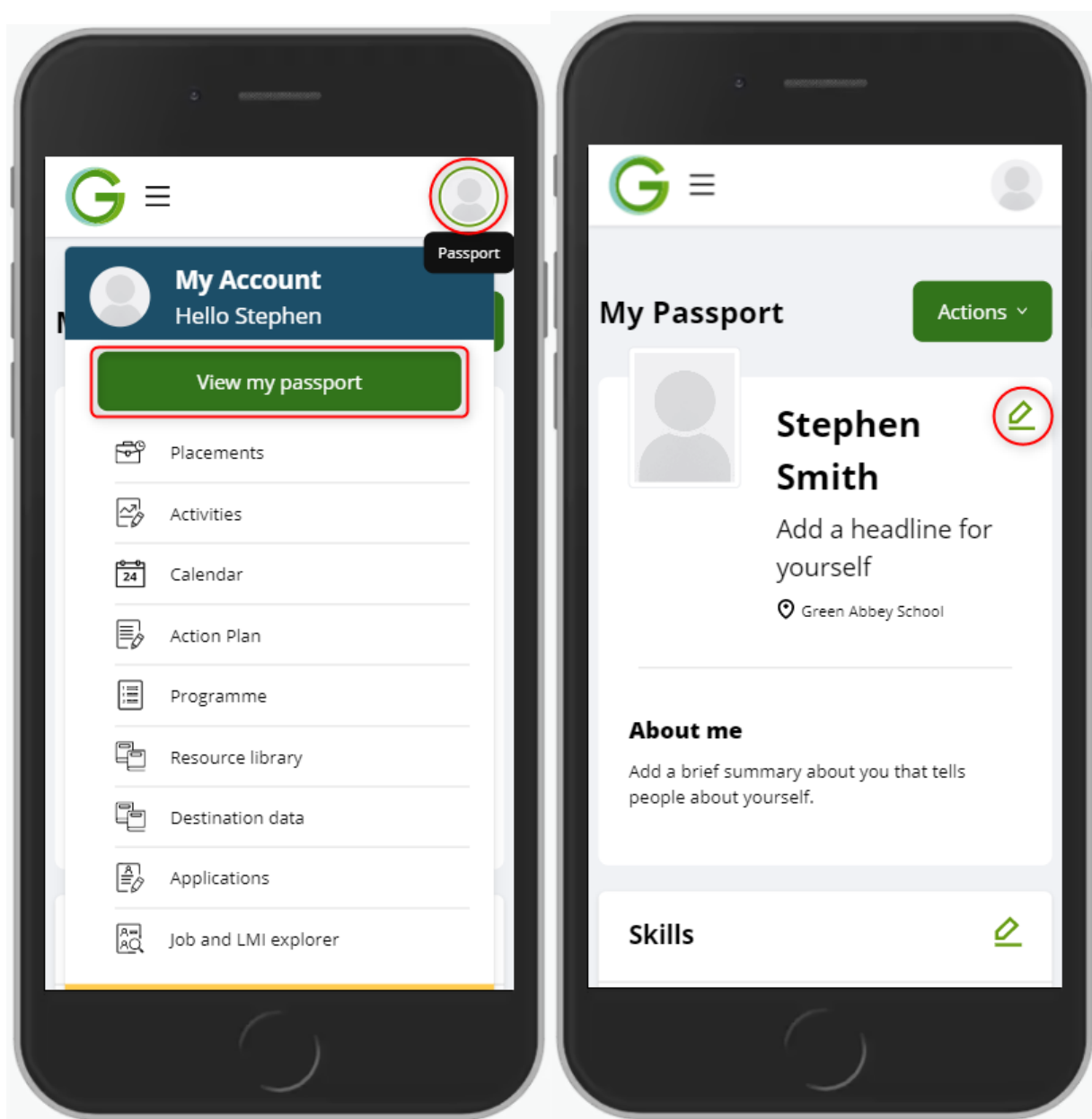
Step 1 – Login to your Student Passport

1. Log into Grofar using your registered email address.

Step 2 – Find the ‘About Me’ page

1. Open the menu bar by clicking the menu icon in the top left of the screen and select ‘View My Passport’, then click on the edit button at the top of the page.



Step 3 – Writing your Personal Statement

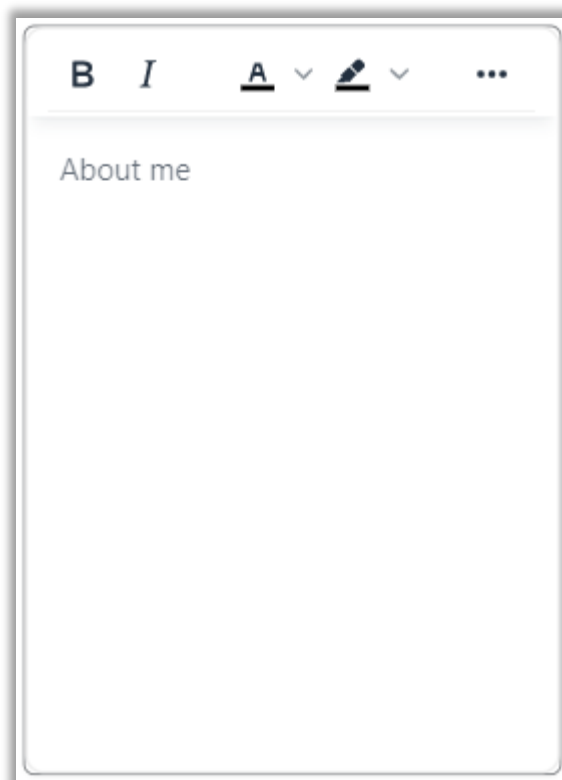
1. Make sure you are in the '**About Me**' text box.
2. This is your space to create your unique personal statement. No matter what age you are, learning to write an engaging statement about yourself is an important skill.
3. You can add style and formatting to your personal statement as you write it. Try adding **headings** and **colours** to your text using the options in the toolbar to make your personal statement stand out.

Your personal statement will be the introduction within your CV which you can download from your digital passport (you will do this in a future activity).

i How to write a university application personal statement

Some things to think about in your personal statement for university:

- Why are you applying for your chosen course(s)? Why does this subject interest you? Include evidence that you understand what's required to study the course.
- Why do you think you're suitable for the course(s)? Do you have any particular skills and experience that will help you to succeed on the course(s)? Do your current or previous studies relate to the course(s) that you have chosen? If so, how? Have you taken part in any other activities that demonstrate your interest in the course(s)?
- Think about any other achievements you're proud of, positions of responsibility that you hold or have held both in and out of school, and attributes that make you interesting, special or unique.
- Make a list of your hobbies, interests and social activities. Then think about how they demonstrate your personality, skills and abilities. Try to link them to the skills and experience required for your course(s).
- Include details of jobs, placements, work experience or voluntary work, particularly if it's relevant to your chosen course(s). Try to link any experience to skills or qualities related to the course.
- Future plans If you know what you'd like to achieve after completing the course, explain how you want to use the knowledge and experience that you gain. How does the course relate to what you want to do in the future?
